

### **SECTION 4. First-Aid Measures**



FIRST AID - EYE CONTACT: Immediately flush eyes with water. Flush eyes with water for a minimum of 15 minutes, occasionally lifting and lowering upper lids. Get medical attention promptly.

# **SECTION 5. Fire-Fighting Measures**

**UNUSUAL FIRE AND EXPLOSION HAZARDS:** Can form explosive mixtures at temperatures at or above the flashpoint. Vapors/dust may cause flash fire or explosion. Empty containers retain product residue (liquid and/or vapor) and can be dangerous.
